ABOUT THE WORKSHOP:

Ontario municipalities, community-based organizations, sports and cultural groups are well-versed in the benefits that participation in recreational activities affords. Media stories and documented research speak to personal health benefits realized, the reduction of isolation felt by marginalized groups and the development of positive life skills, such as teamwork and leadership, which are transferable to work, home and community settings.

Still, many Ontarians are unable to access recreation in their community. The Ontario Task Group on Affordable Access to Recreation has invested three years in researching the best ways to remove barriers to participation. It has created a Provincial Framework for Affordable Access to Recreation. A key result of this work has been the creation of this hands-on workshop designed to help your community make affordable access a reality for all.

In this workshop you will go through a facilitated process to assist your municipality or not-for-profit group in developing an action plan which will pave the way to affordable access. Learn the key questions that need to be considered as you create the framework for your Affordable Access Policy, and hear about potential roadblocks to policy development and how you can effectively address them. Finally, this workshop will provide you with the opportunity to meet others in your community who are also working on this issue. Here is your chance to share information and ideas and to create your own local network supporting the concept of access for all.

Sue Peterson is a Principal with PK Associates, a consulting firm with a mission of empowering groups and individuals. She has over 20 years experience in recreation at the municipal level and has been an instructor in the Conestoga College Recreation and Leisure Services Program for over a decade.
